“There’s not a better place to rear a family than Eungella.

A lot of the hard times was when the rain slipped in.

We used to go down the range and carry up flour and that on our shoulders to make a bit of bread, or the groceries; there was no way in or out for ten days.

People don’t realise that.

In 91, I think, we were [living]^[ed] down there and Alfie was still living up here and I was asking him how the range was and he said ‘No worse than ever it was when we were there’.

And they had a helicopter flew up, of all things, milk, up there was gallons of it, and they flew up bottled milk!”
