




old was discovered in the Eungella area in 1888 and due to the influx of gold miners and their families, schooling first came to the district in 1891 at 'The Diggings' goldfield 7km south of the current township. However the school was closed in 1900 as the gold boom dissipated.

During the 1920s, moves were afoot to establish a school in the Eungella township. Due to small enrolments, only a Provisional school was opened in 1928 with the average attendance for the year being 11 pupils.

By the mid 1930s student numbers were on the increase and a state school was opened on the current school site on 1 July, 1936. The headmaster, Roger Wasley was noted at the time as requesting - "a brick fireplace or some other efficient heating unit be installed."

Dalrymple Heights State School was also opened during the mid 1930s as settlers continued to venture inland.

Meanwhile the increasing population to the south of Eungella in the Crediton area called for regular schooling, as blocks

of land were opened up. A provisional school was opened there in 1944 in the old homestead of Mr and Mrs Ross.

In 1946 the provisional school was moved to the Crediton Hall until the state school was built. This was followed by the West Crediton State School.
