

The Goode Brothers, Jim Brennan then Andy Kelly ran an early store from a hut on the corner of the Eungella flat, during the Public Estate Improvement (PEI) Days. It was pulled down in 1937. Other small stores operated near some of the road camps.

W.B. (Wally) Swayne built and opened the Eungella General Store in January 1931, on the hill corner opposite Andy Kelly's store. This store and post office has had several owners and lessees over the years and still operates as the general store today. When Wally's son Roy was running the store he hired Lou Edwards, initially as a butcher. Harold Petersen came to Eungella as a 14 year old boy to assist Lou in the shop and learn butchering. Harold later went on to have the milk and carrier run from the early 1960s to 1978.

In those days the general store supplied locals with all their groceries, bread, meat and ordered items. Folk would send their order in with the cream truck, the shop would pack it, and it would then be delivered back to the farms. People rarely made the trip to Mackay, maybe once a year for some, usually only for doctor or dental appointments.

In 1947, a second shop was built - just up the road, on the school side of the first store. Swayne built it on the request of his grandson-in-law Arthur Wells. It had three different owners, closing in the late 50s.
